A Message from SGUW

Strong Girls United Women (SGUW) was founded on the simple idea that all women and girls are valuable and have the right to live a life of their choosing, free from pain, physical threat, and fear. It was also founded with the knowledge that for many women and girls in Salone, this is not a reality, and it must change. This is the work of Strong Girls United Women.

SGUW is part of a larger movement – a global one- recognizing the inherent value of women and the myriad of barriers standing in the way of equity. In 2015, the UN passed the 17 Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs). The Goals are an urgent call for action by all countries - developed and developing - in a global partnership. They recognize that ending poverty and other deprivations must go hand-in-hand with strategies to improve health and education, reduce inequality, and spur economic growth – all while tackling climate change and working to preserve our oceans and forests.

The SDGs provide a shared blueprint for peace and prosperity for people and the planet, now and into the future and essential to all of the Goals is women's equality. In fact, Goal 5 is to achieve gender quality and empower all women and girls. Simply put it requires "Gender Equality."

At SGUW, we provide education, mentoring, community building, economic empowerment, health and sexual information. We advocate for change with our allies for land ownership and heredity laws to be changed; we advocate for more women in government and management; we advocate for more GBV prevention, trauma centered care and support for the many victims of trafficking and sexual exploitation. And, we urge the end of FMG in all its forms.

The first step is Adolescent Health classes which are our anchor in communities. The classes build trust between SGUW and the students, their families and community leaders. Two years ago we started with a weekly health class in four schools, we now have rice farming, pineapple farming, woman to woman training for mothers in remote areas, environmental clubs, employment training programs and more. As we've taken on more projects within our communities, our relationship has deepened as has our commitment.

As we look forward to the next three years, we see expansion. We are planning to expand geographically toward the middle and northern regions of Sierra Leone. We also plan to increase our programming in our current locations of Freetown and Bo. We see further partnerships with allied organizations to support their work and our communities. We will also be increasing our development and fundraising scope with a hope of doubling it within a year and then- with our larger footprint- to begin grant seeking on a larger scale.


With expansion comes the need for more administration both in the US and in Salone. In order to accommodate our larger footprint including more staff and volunteers, we will be renting office space in Freetown.


WHERE OUR FUNDING COMES FROM



FUNDS RAISED \$36,475




WHERE OUR FUNDING GOES


